Within Wharite Jessica will provide both Literacy and Maths learning support as part of accelerating student progress. We can help with checklists, advice and recommendations to get you set up for successful lamb, calf or goat rearing.


Phillip Spies from MaxCare will demonstrate correct mixing and feeding techniques for milk replacer powder to give your animals the best start.

calf rearing this season.


There will be product specials, sausage sizzle and a colouring competition.


