We know that these 10 min conferences go really fast so please know you are always welcome to contact our teaching team throughout the term to chat further. 114 appointments were made across the two days of Learning Conferences—but if our time slots didn't work for you please touch base as soon as possible about scheduling a time.

This week has included some great learning experiences across our school and here are a couple of highlights:

 Pā Ronald from Lytton Street School supporting with the teaching of our waiata: Te Ahu a Turanga. We are in the process of selecting a group of 40 students to perform at the Kainui Kapa Haka event later in August. This waiata has been selected as it is significant to our local area and you will also recognise the connection of its name to the new highway being built.

- Our Enviro Crew working with Pou Heidi on our Predator Free project. They made Tracking Tunnels this week and have placed these around our school to see what predators are around. The enthusiasm is huge.
- Our Lunchtime practices for our Dance Squad who will be performing at DanceNZ Made in September. They are learning an awesome routine that has been choreographed by Pou Jo!

One challenge we are having at the moment is with lots of lost property. We love it that our learners come to school with everything they need but often they don't seem to go home with all these things! We have an amazing supply of branded hoodies, sports shoes and oodles of lost socks. Are you missing any clothing? Update - Child & Adolescent Oral Health Service

This letter is to aid expectations and answer concerns raised by some whānau/families. Please feel free to share.

News and radio articles report delays in health services due to workforce vacancies, sickness and the impact of COVID-19. These issues have impacted almost all health services and providers, including the Child and Adolescent Oral Health Service.

The Child and Adolescent Oral Health Service is currently operating at reduced capacity. Many tamariki are waiting up to two years between examinations. We recognise that this is not ideal, however with regular brushing and a healthy diet the risks of tooth decay are vastly reduced. If needed, this link has videos on tooth brushing for pepe and young children https://www.nzda.org.nz/public/resources/oral-health-videos. The plan is return to providing a normal service as and when circumstances allow.

In the meantime should there be any oral health concerns then the service can still be contacted via 0800 825 583 (0800 TALK TEETH) or emailed OralHealth@midcentral.govt.nz and where indicated, an appointment will be made. Also, if an appointment is made and can no longer be kept, please let the service know to reschedule so the time can be used for another child.






