Races will begin at 1.30pm with the Year Ones

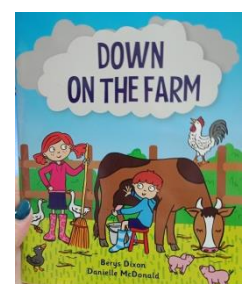
